The illustration is of the psychiatric day hospital at Farnborough, Kent, in 1979. Day patients and inpatients queued together for lunch, then returned to the occupational therapy department, perhaps after attending a relaxation class. Occupational therapy was not just basket weaving or making stuffed toys.



Occupational therapists helped patients, often devastated by depression, learn or relearn living skills such as shopping and cooking.

About David Beales:

I am 63 years old and was an inpatient for nearly seven years on the atric wards, over two of those in the old asylums.
